The 2024 W/ELCA budget was approved and passed

Women of the ELCA Triennial Gathering Phoenix, AZ Sept. 21-24, 2023

Once the Convention was completed, another 8 women from SWPA joined us to attend the Gathering at the Phoenix Convention Center. The mornings of Friday-Sunday had sessions all together with over 1100 Sisters in Faith listening to Bible studies, speakers, music, and devotions. After the opening worship on Thursday evening, there was a street party in downtown Phoenix!! Music, dancing, and food highlighted the night.

The afternoons of Friday and Saturday had a choice of several workshops: Practices for Sabbath Keeping, Preparing your Congregation for Leaders of Color, Writing Workshop, Katie's Fund, Modeling how to Just Love & Just Love Connecting Women, Indian 101, Introduction to Truth & Healing, Book discussion on "Love Without Limits", Love Transcends Boarders and Talking Circle. There were also Servant Events in the Exhibit Hall: AAMPARO – Migrating Mother, Human Trafficking, Community building community (Building Beloved Community and House of Refuge [breaking free from homelessness]) and Raising Up Healthy Women & Girls. Hands-on activities included In-Kind gifts, quilting (with LWR), knitting and an earth lab (World Hunger). A Book store was also there with a variety of books and other gifts featuring "Just Love".

Saturday morning was the 5K Run, Walk and Roll – benefitting Raising Up Healthy Women & Girls. Four of us from SWPA were among the participants.

The Gathering had a closing worship on Sunday morning with the Rev. Tiffany Chaney preaching and the Rev. Kimberly Knowle-Zeller presiding. The Rev. Chaney ended her sermon with these powerful words, "... if we practice Just Love, ...our actions will require unwavering stance for equity...our actions will continually reach for the margins and welcome all. Our actions may not add up according to the world's calculations, but Jesus has not asked us to teach him accounting."

Social and Racial Justice

Seton Hill University presented a panel discussion on Human Trafficking Awareness on September 5, 2023. The Blackburn Center, Greensburg, sponsored this event. The panel was asked questions as to their experience with some of the problems they have observed when dealing with victims of human trafficking.

There are two types of trafficking:

- 1. Sex Trafficking
 - a. Sex trafficking victims are manipulated or forced to engage in sex acts for money.
- 2. Labor Trafficking
 - a. Labor trafficking victims are exploited for work through domestic servitude, debt bondage, or slavery.

In our country, there are 40.3 million considered to be in modern slavery. Human trafficking (sex or slave labor) is people using people for profit and is increasing in our country. Trafficking is hard to detect, as people who are traffickers use methods such as violence, manipulation or false promises of well-paying jobs or romantic relationships to gain and maintain control of their victims. A Red Sand project is being used to make people aware of the trafficking problem. Red Sand is spread in cracks of pavement to show how this problem is spreading.

Our SW Synodical Women do a superb job of feeding our immediate neighbors and certainly must continue to do so. We can have an even greater impact on those neighbors in need that we can feed nationwide by simply sending a letter to the "right" people.

Political activism is another woman's issue. In the newsletter there is a sample letter that can be sent to our congressional representatives in Washington DC that addresses the 2023 Farm Bill. The Farm Bill is extremely important legislation in our anti-hunger mission. The Farm Bill will ask for increased funding for the Food Emergency Fund Assistance Program, Food Banks across the nation, the SNAP program, and food assistance for Native communities and Seniors. The Farm Bill is only addressed once every five years so what is determined now is what will be lived with for the next five years. Please copy the letter included in this newsletter and mail signed copies (and as many as you can get from others) to our Congressional Representatives in Washington DC. You may use the letterhead as is or change it to your church's letterhead. A personal note of concern would be a good addition to the letter. Letter writing campaigns are effective, so let's do it and help our neighbors who are hungry!

It is with a heavy heart that the women of St. Paul's Sewickley are giving up their 2 educational (but a lot of fun) programs.


The Lenten Fair – 18 booths, all about Lent and Easter, transitions, food, crafts, information. Admission one hardboiled egg.

SOUTHWESTERN PENNSYLVANIA SYNODICAL WOMEN'S ORGANIZATION

Dear Senator Date:

As a constituent, I am grateful for the farmers, food banks, and others working hard to feed our country. But as grocery prices remain high and supply chair disruptions continue, hunger grows. In 2021, 53 million people sought charitable food assistance. That's 1 in every 6 people in the U.S. and a 33% increase since 2019.

As an anti-hunger advocate, I'm asking you to double down on our nation's commitment to ending hunger by strengthening critical anti-hunger programs in the 2023 Farm Bill. This includes:

- Increase funding for food purchases through the Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP). A steady, continuous stream of TEFAP foods is essential to help ensure food can continue serving everyone facing hunger in our communities.
- Increase funding for TEFAP storage and distribution and continue funding TEFAP infrastructure grants. These funds will help food banks offset the cost of storing and transporting USDA foods, especially in rural communities. They will help cover expenses like refrigeration and fuel.
- Increase funding and streamline state participation in the TEFAP Farm to Food Bank Program
 by removing the state match and allowing states to prioritize projects for donated food or food
 purchased at low cost from local growers and producers.
- Increase purchasing power for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) basing benefits on the Low-Cost Food Plan to bring benefit amounts in line with grocery prices and need.
- Simplify and streamline SNAP eligibility and enrollment processes to improve access for seniors, college students, immigrants and other groups who face barriers to participating in the program.
- End SNAP's three-month time limit for able-bodied adults without dependents and adequately fund and improve state employment and training programs. This will help ensure people have the food and training opportunities they need to get back on their feet.
- Create parity in food assistance for U.S territories by allowing them to transition from capped Nutrition Assistance Program (NAP) block grants to full participation in SNAP.
- Ensure sovereignty for Native communities by allowing tribal governments to administer federal nutrition programs and allowing SNAP participants to also receive benefits through the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations.
- Reauthorize and streamline reporting for the Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) to support the nutrition needs of seniors.
