We're better together; it's the very definition of "synod": on the journey together. When creative energy & collaboration meet ministry, the results are vibrant Christian communities.




Case Study: Joint-parish revitalization results from ELCA training.

"Several members of my congregations had the opportunity to participate in the Congregational Vitality training offered by the ELCA and were inspired to create a Vital Congregations Taskforce. The taskforce has created a joint-parish mission statement, added signage, updated pew cards, and created a QR code for members to invite others. We also visited with Beaver County commissioners and the executive director of the Beaver Women's Center to deepen relationships and learn more about needs in the community. We are excited to participate in the ribbon cutting and opening of a new men's shelter for Beaver County and will serve monthly meals.

The Congregational Vitality training has invited us to listen and reflect, ask questions and think creatively about how to be more present in the community."




Case Study: Perry Highway Lutheran Church's path to communal healing after trauma.

"Perry Highway Lutheran Church has had its share of ups and downs. With the departure of our pastor of over 25 years and COVID hitting us two months later, our congregation losing parishioners rapidly. was With the help of our synod, we obtained a wonderful intentional interim pastor who was with us for two years. She helped guide us along through our trauma; and with care and the determination of our members and our synod, our interim pastor and an assistant to the bishop were able to bring us out of our sad times into looking to call a new pastor. After a short period of five months, we called a new warm and vibrant pastor. Our congregation is now growing with our new exciting pastor and a message of inclusion and growth.

Healthy & growing leaders are needed for healthy & growing congregations, which is why the synod is constantly offering training & formative experiences for rostered and lay leaders.




Case Study: "Care With the Word" educational event

"As a lay worship Leader and life-long learner, I am continually looking for educational opportunities to expand the knowledge I gained during my year-long lay ministry training at Luther Seminary. While our synod has a rich history of continuing education for ordained pastors, Bishop Kusserow recently invited lay worship leaders to take part in a two-part class, alongside the clergy of our synod, in which we studied *Preaching and Teaching "With Love and Respect for the Jewish People."*

I gained valuable insight and practical ideas for preaching and teaching the two congregations I currently serve. As anti-Semitism continues to be on the rise, we talked about the importance of the words, images, and messages we deliver in our sermons and in our teachings. In turn, the members of our congregations will experience God's love and mercy as we share how the Holy Scriptures are filled with grace for all."

Because Christ dwells in us, we are sent into the world to be his hands & feet. The synod commissions & supports ministries in our local congregations & throughout the world.




Case Study: The synod's second annual Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Commemoration event

"The Authentic Diversity and Justice team is a synod working group focused on building 'authentic' inclusion and diversity in our congregations and fighting all forms of oppression in our organization and in our region. The Martin Luther King Jr. commemoration is organized annually as a means of creating greater opportunities for individual and congregational engagement in this ongoing work.

In 2023, the engagement centered on addressing housing needs that are integral to Dr. King's vision of a beloved community and collaborating with ecumenical, interfaith and community partners to achieve measurable progress. We identified the many housing ministries currently organized or supported by our congregations and encouraged their support.

Both locally and nationally, lives are changed through financial contributions and the hands-on care of ministry teams and social ministry organizations. The work done via these channels also creates a way for individual Lutherans, congregations, and communities throughout southwestern Pennsylvania to work together towards common goals.

ORGANIZATION & ADMINISTRATION




The Synod provides additional infrastructure, resources, & coordination for Lutherans throughout southwestern Pennsylvania. More ministry & service is possible because of our shared work.



Case Study: Michelle Snyder was a guest speaker at a Monthly Ministerium online gathering to discuss how we can live and thrive within seasons of bracing for change. "It's not uncommon, when asked to do a Zoom meeting with a group of pastors, for the request to come with a pre-meeting.... A 'get-our-ducks-in-arow' conversation. It's usually about start times, who's in charge of breakout rooms, and hoped for outcomes. But when I got on the call with the staff of this synod, it was a very different kind of meeting.

This group of thoughtful folks spent an hour reflecting deeply with me. They very caringly laid out what they thought would be useful and why, in their deliberations, they thought I would be the person to lead it. The meeting was not perfunctory; it was mindful and intentional. And it made my experience of working with the ministerium all the more robust as a result."
